I can remember stopping by the side of the road, turning the radio up loud and having what we called street dances after the clubs closed. I always got in trouble for not getting home on time.

My heart has always been at the beach and as soon as I was old enough I moved here and started coming to The Pad, Sonny's Pavilion, The Town House, Cagney's and The Army Navy Club for afterhours. Anywhere there was music and a dance floor that is where I wanted to be.
