I will always remember he would tell me, "You have to stay in the square", but as most of you know I didn't listen. After years of dancing I developed my own style.

We always had a place to dance, drink and party every Saturday night at Williams Lake and every Sunday at Castaways in Greensboro and on Wednesday and Friday nights at the Scrambled Dog in Raleigh. I have lots of good memories and funny stories to tell about these days.

After a short time there I moved to New York City to work as a showroom boy for about a year and then on to Minnesota for another job. Well, I phoned my buddies back in NC and they were drinking and partying at the State Fair. Feeling homesick, I packed up and went back to Raleigh.

I have been very fortunate to remain friends with so many people along the way.
